## **THE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN**

Dear Friends,

Why do we belong to the Friends of the Texas Room?

Our first and most important reason is philanthropy for the preservation of our local history. At its last meeting, your board voted to fund the digitization of the last 43 tapes in the HMRC's Oral History Collection. The rest of the collection was digitized earlier with funds from grants which have run out. This project will begin immediately, and soon the remaining taped interviews of persons involved in the development of all aspects of our community will be available on line. Most of the individuals in the interviews are now deceased. They include such people as Nina Cullinan. Carol and Harris Masterson, and people who were involved in the first controversy over zoning. They give rare insight into the stories behind the dry historical facts. At present they are inaccessible to the public because the library's equipment for playing them has worn out.

The HMRC is in the process of assessing overhead scanning machines which can scan rare and fragile books with a minimum need for manipulation of the book spines, pages, and covers. These machines also are better options for scanning magazines, newspapers, photographs and document than the conventional copy machines now in use. When they make a decision, we hope to be able to purchase the machine for them.

Without our financial support, the HMRC cannot keep up with the changing technology which, along with its incomparable collections, sets it apart as a first class institution.

### **MINUTES OF THE April 25th, 2016, GENERAL MEETING**

President Dorothy Knox Houghton called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m.

The minutes of the prior meeting were approved from the floor.

Mike Vance, author of *Houston Baseball: The Early Years 1861 to 1961*, made a presentation entitled "Three Ballparks--Pre-World War II Baseball in Houston." As in New Orleans and Galveston, baseball was brought to Houston by workers who arrived from New York and New England. Ball clubs were established as early as 1859, but the game took off in the post war period of 1866 to 1868. Local newspapers reported a game played on San Jacinto Day at which Ashbel Smith, who had become acquainted with Sam Houston in 1837, served as the Secretary of State and a Texas diplomat

during the years of the Republic, helped negotiate the peace at the end of the Civil War, organized and was the first President of the Texas Historical Society in 1870, served in the Legislature, and helped establish both Prairie View A&M and the University of Texas, addressed the assemblage. Most games were played on the clay surface of the brick yard on the north end of town.

The Texas Association was founded in 1884 consisting of semi-pro teams on which certain players were paid. The first exhibition pro game was held in 1877 between the Chicago White Stockings and the St. Louis Browns. The Texas League was organized in 1888. The Houston team, organized in 1889, was called the Mud Cats and became the Houston Buffalos in 1896. They played in the ballpark at Milam and McGowen streets. In 1904 the park was moved to the Harrisburg race track. At the West End Park, there were college football games between Notre Dame and both Texas and Rice in 1915, and UT and A&M played a game there for four years. In 1916, a local business group bought the Houston Buffs on behalf of Branch Rickey of the Cardinals which then was contrary to League Rules prohibiting farm teams. The Houston Black Buffalos played there in the 1920s, including the 1929 -1930 World Series against the Kansas City Monarchs of the old Negro Baseball League. Buff stadium was built in 1928 and among other things, sold mosquito spray by the squirt: 5¢ for three squirts. Inaugurated night games began in 1930.

## **NEWS FROM THE TEXAS ROOM**

In keeping with HMRC's objective of providing access to Houston's history, which includes its historic home in the Julia Ideson Building, the library offers group tours of the building based on docent availability. However, with increasing interest in the building, the demand for tours has grown, making it challenging to accommodate all requests. Consequently, in an effort to better serve our customer's requests HMRC, with funding and support from the Friends of the Texas Room, developed an audio tour with an accompanying website to provide an alternative tour option for those who are not able to schedule tours, or would like to tour the building from a remote location. With OnCell's mobile tour technology, our customers have access to a multimedia tour on the Internet, on smart mobile devices, or even using basic cell phones. The mobile tour app also works with accessibility options on most devices for the visually- and hearing-impaired to expand and enhance the customer's experience and better meet user needs.

Currently there are eighteen tour stops positioned throughout the building marked with signs. These sites represent important features of the building and interesting facts about the architecture, furnishings, and the history of the library and the city. Whether accessed in the building or online, customers are given an educational tour experience filled with beautiful custom photos, videos, and audio all available at their own pace. The tour has been accessed hundreds of times since its launch in October 2015, and we have received considerable praise for its usability, information content, and convenience.

Since the tour is built on a flexible platform, our account allows us to add multiple languages, input our organization's brand into the site, create interactive images, and add additional tours, games, and other interactive tour experiences to the website. Future plans for this application include creating a scavenger hunt for younger visitors, creating customized tours for specific subject areas including oral histories, HMRC's book collections, and artwork in the building, and providing audio/ visual supplements for features in upcoming exhibitions. (Details forthcoming) **Writing Workshop: *Handbook of Houston Talk*** of an encyclopedic-style collection of Houston's history began in earnest in 2008, when professional and avocational historians started meeting regularly to discuss the idea. A 2015 partnership between the Texas State Historical Association (TSHA) and Houston History Alliance (HHA), along with the generous underwriting of Houston Endowment, has made it possible for the project to move forward.

The Houston Metropolitan Research Center (HMRC) has been involved with this project since its inception, sharing both staff expertise and resources.

The *Handbook of Houston* will be the first regional offshoot of the TSHA statewide resource, the *Handbook of Texas Online*, the most widely cited history resource in Texas.

The *Handbook* committee is actively recruiting authors interested in writing about all aspects of Houston history. Topical workshops are being held in the next few months.
