Houston historian Sandra Lord is the speaker for our October 25th, 2021, annual meeting at 7:00 pm. Her presentation is titled "The Ghosts of Houston's Market Square."



About our speaker . . . After graduating from Smith College in Massachusetts, Sandra Lord adopted Houston as her new home and founded Discover Houston Tours, the city's first and longest continually operating public guided tour company. To date, Discover Houston Tours has conducted nearly 5,000 tours for 61,000 visitors from around the world. Co-founder of the Professional Tour Guide Association of Houston, Lord has published over 100 articles on Houston history and has researched and designed over 100 itineraries for historical and cultural walking and bus tours. With co-

author Debe Branning, Lord recently published *The Ghosts of Houston's Market Square*. In addition to her writing, she now owns and operates Houston Walks.

Dorothy Johnson, long-time Friends of the Texas Room member, passed away on June 24, 2021, in Houston. She was a charter member of FTxR and served as the first membership chair. Dorothy supported numerous Houston-area organizations and freely volunteered her time and expertise. As noted in her obituary, she was a member of the mailing committee for the Museum of Fine Arts – Houston, a member of Clayton Library Friends, and a member of the Houston Genealogical Forum. She also spent many hours taking classes at The Women's Institute, where she served as a Board member. She also devoted time to genealogy projects. MINUTES FROM THE JULY 2021 MEETING

After calling the meeting to order at 7:00, President Mister McKinney thanked the FTxR Board members and welcomed FTxR members and guests.

Next, Mister McKinney introduced the speaker for the July 2021 meeting: historian Kimber Fountain. Fountain, a native of the Texas Gulf Coast and longtime resident of

Galveston Island, has published several books on the city's rich history: Galveston Seawall Chronicles and Galveston's Red Light District: A History of the Line. At the July 2021 meeting, Fountain spoke on the topic of her book The Maceos and the Free State of Galveston. Fountain also serves as chair of the Arts & Historic Preservation Advisory Board to Galveston's City Council and is occasionally seen on stage at the Island East-End Theatre Company. After Fountain's presentation and a short

question and answer period, Mister McKinney adjourned the evening's event.

UPDATE ON THE JULIA IDESON AWARD

FRIENDS OF THE TEXAS ROOM POLICIES

The FTxR policies relate to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library.

A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library. The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library. The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

CULTURAL MATCHING GIFTS

The award commemorates the Houston Public Library's first director, Julia Bedford Ideson (1885-1945) and recognizes distinguished projects that document Houston and Texas history and culture.

The Julia Ideson Award and a prize of \$500.00 will be presented to the winner by the Friends of the Texas Room at its annual meeting on October 25, 2021. Eligibility: In 2021, the call for entries is for scholarly researched and published books completed within the past five years (2016-2021) that document local Houston and/or Texas history and culture by USING THE RESOURCES OF THE HOUSTON METROPOLITAN RESEARCH CENTER'S TEXAS ROOM SIGNIFICANTLY, BUT NOT NECESSARILY EXCLUSIVELY.

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH EACH ENTRY:

1. Name, address, telephone number, and e-mail of the person(s) or organization nominating and submitting the book.

2. Brief description (three to five sentences) of the book.

3. LIST OF SPECIFIC RESOURCES OF THE TEXAS ROOM / HOUSTON METROPOLITAN RESEARCH CENTER USED IN THE BOOK AND BRIEF NOTE ON HOW THESE RESOURCES WERE USED.

4. Brief explanation (three to five sentences) of how the book contributes to a better understanding of local or Texas history/culture.

5. One copy of the book.

SUBMISSION:

Books must be submitted in the name of the author(s) or organization. Submitting an entry constitutes agreement to the terms of eligibility and serves as agreement that the Friends of the Texas Room may publicize the award and accompanying details about the recipient(s). All submitted copies of books will become the property of the Houston Metropolitan Research Center.
