His presentation was very well received and prompted many questions and poignant remarks and reminiscences from audience members.


The meeting concluded around 8:00 pm.

NEWS FROM THE TEXAS ROOM

In February, HMRC welcomed its new Photography Archive Supervisor, Andrew Mancuso. He succeeds Tim Ronk, who has recently retired from his library career to spend more time writing and fulfilling other creative pursuits. Tim plans to return to volunteer with HMRC in the near future.

Andrew is charged with serving as a project manager for photo reproduction and digitization projects. He will lead HMRC's digital preservation program and process photo-related collections. He will also play an active role in capturing, editing, reformatting, describing, and uploading images online.

In May of 2014, Andrew graduated from Dominican University in River Forest, IL with a Master of Library & Information Science with a focus on metadata, archives, and digitization. Since then he has continued his education by taking course such as Care of Paper Artifacts, Book Repair Techniques for Special Collections, and Introduction to Organic and Inorganic Materials from the Campbell Center for Historic Preservation Studies. He also received a Certificate in Artifact Collection Care from the University of Chicago in September 2015. He has worked as a Metadata Assistant at the McDonald's Corporation, a Document Imaging Specialist at the Hyatt Corporation - Chicago, IL, a Digitization Specialist/Project Archivist/Imaging Technician with The Digital Archive Group - Chicago, IL, and was a 2016 Mary and Samuel Somit Preservation Intern at the University of Chicago.

Andrew has already embraced his new role with vigor. He has worked diligently to address some of the challenges we face in managing the large numbers of photo reproduction orders and digital project initiatives and providing reference assistance for our customers researching our massive, complex archive of images. He has worked to add more networked digital content storage space to store preservation-quality image files, reconciled and merged photo databases to enable us to provide broader access to collection information online, recommended equipment to provide a better quality digital products and increased efficiency, and is troubleshooting project processes and workflows and in resolving problems. He is also quickly becoming familiar with our photo collections and is assisting with grant writing, social media promotion, and photo-related programming.

We will have materials on the display, behind-the-scenes tours, demonstrations, and exclusive access to non-public areas to learn about what we do at HMRC. Visitors can observe archival processing activities, conservation and repair work, image digitization and reproduction, and our state-of-the-art storage areas.

FRIENDS OF THE TEXAS ROOM POLICIES

The FTxR policies relate to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library.

A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library.

The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library.

The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

CULTURAL MATCHING GIFTS
