The Museum of Printing History is located at 1324 W. Clay Street between Waugh Drive and Montrose, one block south of West Dallas. Free parking is available in the lot across the street or in the small lot on the left, adjacent to the Museum building.

Those of you who have visited the Central Branch of the Library in recent weeks know that the renovation of the Jones Building has begun. Some staff members and library services are moving to the Julia Ideson Building temporarily until the Jones Building renovations are complete. This will not affect the functioning of the HMRC. The Texas Room will be open to researchers as usual.

The library administration has appointed Stephen Hill to be the new Assistant Manager for Reference Services for the HMRC. He has a long track record in reference services, management, and staff supervision within the Houston Public Library system. His biographical information, along with that of other new staff appointees, can be found elsewhere in this newsletter.

The documentary on the holdings of the HMRC is moving forward. The producer of the documentary, Sunset Productions, has filmed the majority of the historical materials (maps, architectural drawings, rare books, paintings, and photographs) which will be featured. #### HOUSTON METROPOLITAN RESEARCH CENTER STAFF UPDATE

The new HMRC Assistant Manager for Reference Services is Stephen Hill. His B.S. (Political Science with a minor in History) and MLIS are from the University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee. After working as a reference intern at the Golda Meir Library, he joined the staff at Houston Public Library 15 years ago. He worked in Branch Services, and served as Acting or Assistant Manager at Hillendahl, Lakewood, and Henington-Alief. He also served as the Adult Services Librarian for the Alief Region. He then transferred to Central Services, where he has served as Assistant Manager of the Humanities Dept. and, most recently, Assistant Manager of the Business, Science & Technology Dept. He brings both reference expertise and strong management and supervisory skills to HMRC.

The closure of the Jesse Jones Building and the transition to HPL Express Downtown in the Julia Ideson Building have resulted in many changes in Central Services. During the 18-24 renovation period, many staff will be deployed to other sites, both to provide staff support for branches and also for the benefit of cross-training. Several HMRC staff are participating in the deployment: Wendy Willeford and Nina Oliver were deployed to the Stella Link Branch in March; in April, Andy Hempe, Ron Lee, and Doug Weiskopf will be deployed to Stella Link, Robinson-Westchase, and Scenic Woods Branches respectively.

The deployment experience has been very positive. Nina writes from Stella Link:

"This email is to THANK YOU for the transfer here. The staff is great as well as the patrons. My working life is so different here from HMRC-TXR...I have learned so much in a month. Working in a branch full time is so different but to me very rewarding. Again, Thank You for considering me for this temporary assignment."

Deployment will also bring staff from other Central Services units to HMRC.

Amy Taylor reported to HMRC in March. She has a BA from Texas A&M University with a major in History; she worked as a testing supervisor at A&M. She is in progress toward an MLA at the University of St. Thomas. Her second language is Japanese. Amy worked for about a year in the Business, Science & Technology Department before her deployment to HMRC.

Fred Mondrik has a BA in History from Queens College of the City University of New York, and an MA in History from the University of Houston. He worked as a Teaching Assistant at the University of Houston History Department. Fred is bilingual in English and Spanish. He has 30 years of service at Houston Public Library. His first assignment was in Archives just prior to the establishment of the HMRC. He worked for three years at the Denver Harbor Branch (now the Cliff Tuttle Branch). Since 1977 he has worked in the Social Sciences Department (now Fine Arts/Social Sciences Department) at the Central Library.

Ingrid Grant is a native Houstonian and has a BA from the University of St. Thomas with a double major in International Studies and French. Ingrid has eight years of reference experience at HPL, including six years in the Business, Science & Technology Department and two years in the Humanities Department.

Fred Parris has worked at HPL for more than ten years in the Business, Science & Technology Dept. His BS (Journalism) and MLS are from the University of Kansas. He is the author of *All You Can Eat*, a 234-page guide to buffet restaurants throughout Texas and the United States.

Rachel Davis has worked at HPL for six years. She joined the staff as a Library Assistant and was promoted to Senior Library Assistant, working in the Circulation Department and in the Humanities Department. For the past year, she has worked as the Administrative Aide for the Humanities and Fine Arts/Social Sciences Departments. She is a model of efficiency and productivity and provides excellent support for customer service.

## RARE BOOKS AND ARCHIVES UPDATE

The Houston Metropolitan Research Center staff has completed an inventory of the Norma Meldrum Collection, one of our juvenile special collections. This inventory involved gathering the collection back into one location and placing it in a single shelving sequence, ensuring that all items were barcoded, and that all items were reflected in the catalog. Items not found have been identified; we have retained the bibliographic records so that they can be restored if we find additional Norma Meldrum Room materials as we complete inventory of other special collections. Staff from the Processing Department in the Technical Services Division assisted with the inventory, including barcoding, scanning, and processing files through the inventory control module of our integrated library system.

Welch Collection (MSS 0077) Update: We were fortunate to receive a \$36,000 grant from the Welch Foundation in 2004 to complete conservation and processing of this archival collection. Cheryl Carrabba, of Carrabba Conservation Inc., evaluated the collection and recommended steps for conservation. Preservation Technologies Inc. completed mass deacidification of the entire collection. We recently contracted with Processing Archivist Mark Carley to begin actual processing of the materials.

## WHAT OUR FRIENDS ARE DOING

The Greater Houston Preservation Alliance is developing an online History of Houston Museum. It will, eventually, tell the entire history of Houston through the use of narratives and archival materials from numerous collections in the area. Betty Chapman and Steven Strom are serving on the

Steering Committee for this project. Betty is the historian, working on the content, while Steven represents the archival collections of the Houston Metropolitan Research Center. You can go to <a href="https://www.historyofhouston.org">www.historyofhouston.org</a> to check it out. It is still in the very early developmental stages, however.

Last fall Mayor Bill White appointed a Task Force on Houston's History and asked the group to determine how to educate Houstonians about the city's history and to identify all of the existing historical resources in the city. During the past six months, 65 Houstonians have served on five committees to study the mayor's mandate. Friends of the Texas Room were well represented in this process. Betty Chapman has served as the over-all chairman; Barrie Scardino and Joe Pratt have chaired individual committees; and members of the Task Force include Trevia Beverly, Minnette Boesel, Ralf Brehm, Nancy Burch, Renee Cross, Barbara Eaves, Jim Fisher, Stephen Fox, Willie Lee Gay, Paul Homeyer, Dorothy Knox Houghton, Sandra Lord, Graham Luhn, Louis Marchiafava, Anne Sloan, Story Sloane, Steven Strom, Bart Truxillo, and Caro Ivy Walker. The Task Force is currently preparing a final report which will contain their recommendations to the mayor for future action.
