### THE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Dear Friends:

The winter newsletter is a little late for several reasons. The Museum of Printing History is becoming so popular for meetings of organizations such as ours that we were unable to find a date in January when they could accommodate us. Then we had to coordinate the date with the speaker. Finally, our board was planning a retreat in late January on which we wanted to report in this newsletter.

Not having circulated the minutes from the October meeting in the newsletter, we could not approve them at the February 1 meeting. Therefore, the minutes from the October 2004 meeting and from the February 2005 meeting both will appear in the April newsletter so that we can approve both at the April membership meeting. We appreciate your patience.

It is my privilege and great pleasure to report that Mayor White declared Saturday, February 5, 2005 to be Betty Chapman Day in Houston. The mayor honored the secretary of the Friends for her wonderful book on the history of the Houston Public Library and for her role in writing the text of the official Texas Historical Marker for the library, which was unveiled that day. This marker replaces an earlier one that had disappeared. Betty also was honored for her many hours of volunteer service to the library, which include her tireless efforts on behalf of the Friends of the Texas Room. Congratulations on many jobs well done, Betty!

Undoubtedly you have read in the news media that Barbara Gubbin, Director of the Houston Public Library System, resigned to become Director of the Jacksonville (Florida) Public Library System effective December 31, 2004. Toni Lambert, Deputy Director of Library Operations, is now Acting Director of the Houston Public Library until a new director is chosen.

On Saturday, January 29, 2005, your board held a retreat to plan for the next two years. Now that our organization is well established, we need to broaden our involvement and raise our profile in the community. To that end we decided to hold monthly board meetings, and we established several working committees:

Communications \* Membership Programs \* By-laws Development

The Communications Committee will coordinate the newsletter, website, and general publicity. Among the goals for the Programs Committee will be an annual symposium with a call for papers and possibly a lecture series. The Bylaws Committee will revise and refine our by-laws. A Development Committee will be needed as we expand our activities.

Our speaker at the February 1 meeting was Dr. Joseph A. Pratt, editor of the <u>Houston Review of History and Culture</u>, which originated at the HMRC but now is published at the University of Houston. Dr. Pratt gave an inspiring talk and encouraged the amateur historians among us to send him articles on subjects relating to Houston history. He is talking with our board about how we might work more closely together in the future.

We look forward to the active participation of all our members in the next two years.
