# MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 26<sup>TH</sup>, 2008, GENERAL MEETING

The Friends of the Texas Room met at the Looscan Branch of the Houston Public Library, 2510 Willowick, on October 27, 2008. After a brief reception and refreshments, President Dorothy Knox Houghton called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m. She introduced the speaker, Jesús Francisco De La Teja, Ph.D., Texas State Historian, who gave an informative presentation entitled, "Expanding the Story of Houston For a 21<sup>st</sup> Century Audience."

Following the guest speaker's presentation, President Dorothy Knox Houghton convened the business portion of the meeting. Motions were made and seconded to dispense with the reading of the July 28, 2008, Meeting Minutes and the Treasurer's Report, which were approved by acclamation.

President Houghton thanked the previous board officers for their service.

Nancy Burch, Nominating Committee Chair, presented the committee's recommendations for board officers for the 2009-10 term. A motion was made and seconded to approve the new slate of officers by acclamation.

Following the election of new officers, President Houghton presented the Julia Ideson Award to David Welling, for his book, *Cinema Houston*. Following the presentation and remarks by Mr. Welling, President Houghton announced that the Friends of the Texas Room were being honored by the Greater Houston

Preservation Alliance with a "Good Brick Award" for the production of the documentary film, "In Search of Houston's History."

There being no additional business, the meeting adjourned at 7:05 p.m.

#### **NEWS FROM THE TEXAS ROOM**

The news from this past quarter is really all about the news. We have had a great deal of media attention paid to the HMRC world: A photo session with Andrea White in the Texas Room; a television article for Channel 13; an in depth interview regarding special treasures in the collection for *City Savvy*; a photo session in Special Collections for a *Houston Chronicle* article.

The 100% building expansion plans have been accepted, bids have been submitted and approved, and the ground breaking is scheduled. We are ready to grow!

The major goal of conducting an inventory of the Texas Room book collection has been met. In 2008, approximately 31,300 books were taken into account.

Dr. Lawson has approved the following progressive, temporary schedule for closing HMRC to allow staff the time to properly process collections and prepare them for moving into the new archival storage wing. I will give more specific details regarding arrangements in the next newsletter.

## Policies of the Friends of the Texas Room

Relating to The Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library

## A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library.

The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library.

The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

#### B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

## **CULTURAL MATCHING GIFTS**

Are you or your spouse working for or retired from a corporation which makes cultural matching grants or volunteer involvement awards if you give to or do volunteer work for a cultural institution?

Will your employer match your gifts to cultural institutions that qualify under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code?

The Friends of the Texas Room has such a qualification. Send your corporation's cultural matching funds form with your check for membership in FTR. If you volunteer your time as an officer of FTR or in the Texas Room or HMRC, keep track of your hours and turn them in to your corporation so that the FTR may obtain a grant from your corporation's program. This is "found money" for FTR and can be used towards making a difference to the Texas Room and HMRC.
