MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 27TH, 2009, GENERAL MEETING

The Friends of the Texas Room met at the Carriage House of the Clayton Genealogy Library Center for Genealogical Research, 5300 Caroline St., on Tuesday October 27, 2009. Following a reception and refreshments President Dorothy Knox Houghton called the meeting to order at 6:40 P.M. President Houghton requested a motion to dispense with the reading of the Minutes since they had been emailed in advance. A motion was made and seconded to approve and dispense with the reading of the emailed Minutes of the July 27, 2009 meeting. Motion carried.

Treasurer Cathy Fitch reported a balance of \$740.26 in the checking account, \$11,166.32 in the savings account, and \$20,000 in a CD for a Total Funds of \$31,906.58.

Dorothy Knox Houghton announced that the Friends of the Texas Room has provided \$5000.00 to match a 2009 TexTreasures Grant from the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to digitize another set of interviews in the HMRC Oral History project. Houghton then introduced Ms. Kemo Curry, Director of the Houston Metropolitan Research Center, who provided an update on the construction of the new wing. Curry stated the work was proceeding very well and talked about some of the features in the New Wing. She also suggested some ideas on how the Friends of the Texas Room could participate in furnishing or decorating the new facility. President Houghton thanked Curry and stated that the Board would take her suggestions under advisement.

Following this, President Houghton presented the 2009 Julia Ideson Award to Dr. Michael Botson for his book, *Labor, Civil Rights, and the Hughes Tool Company*. Dr. Botson spoke about the importance of the collections in the HMRC/Texas Room and their significance for the people of Houston. President Houghton then introduced Michael Vance who received the 2009 Julia Ideson Award Honorable Mention for his historical television program, *Postcards from Texas*. Mr. Vance spoke about his research experience in the HMRC/Texas Room from his school days until the present.

There being no additional business, the meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

We hope you were able to join us on December 14, 2009, at the ceremonial ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new archival wing of the Julia Ideson Building. A big thank you goes out to the Friends of the Texas Room for serving as hosts at this event. Attendees received tours of the outdoor reading room, the high-density shelving area, the rare books room, and the research/reference room. Preparations are underway to move HMRC's archival and book collections to the new storage wing shortly. Rest assured that staff is hard at work to make sure the collections are moved properly and that upon our re-opening in mid-Spring 2010, we can serve you better.

The <u>Houston Public Library Digital Archives</u> site is continually expanding its holdings. Please keep in mind that it is a work in progress, but recent additions might make the site useful to your research needs. Books including *George Hunter Bringhurst Field Notes, Houston Town Company Book of Sales, The Lone Star: A Tale of Texas, Founded upon Incidents in the History of Texas,* and *The Red Book of Houston: A Compendium of Social, Professional, Religious, Educational and Industrial Interest of Houston's Colored Population* are available through the <u>Houston Public Library Digital Archives</u> as are interviews that were part of the Houston Oral History Project.

POLICIES

Policies of the Friends of the Texas Room

Relating to The Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library

A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library.

The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library.

The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

CULTURAL MATCHING GIFTS

Are you or your spouse working for or retired from a corporation which makes cultural matching grants or volunteer involvement awards if you give to or do volunteer work for a cultural institution?

Will your employer match your gifts to cultural institutions that qualify under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code?

The Friends of the Texas Room has such a qualification. Send your corporation's cultural matching funds form with your check for membership in FTR. If you volunteer your time as an officer of FTR or in the Texas Room or HMRC, keep

track of your hours and turn them in to your corporation so that the FTR may obtain a grant from your corporation's program. This is "found money" for FTR and can be used towards making a difference to the Texas Room and HMRC.
