NEWS FROM THE TEXAS ROOM

Greetings to all of our Friends from the Texas Room! I trust this newsletter finds each of you content and doing well. Given this is the beginning of the summer season, I'll fill you in on some hot news from the front line of the Houston Metropolitan Research Center (HMRC).

One special activity worth mentioning this quarter includes the HMRC hosting the annual Friends of the Library meeting in June. Notably, it was the most heavily attended meeting in many years. Evidently, both staff and the public attended in record numbers and we believe this is a sign of an increased interest in our facility and collections.

Speaking of collections, additional materials on the Shamrock Hotel were donated by the daughter of the hotel accountant. Included in this small collection are photos, announcements, a menu from the restaurant, cocktail napkins, newspaper clippings etc. Just the sort of things you'd expect to find in a little gem of a collection such as this. Also, HMRC collections have provided materials for *Tundra Turnaround*, a video production for NBA TV and other materials were used for the article "Matrimony and the Mayors of Houston," which will appear in the *Houston History Magazine*.

On the technical side of things, our photo lab is pleased to announce the arrival of their new digital equipment. We are thrilled about the potential for this new equipment and anticipate it could expedite the processing of our reproduction orders in the years to come.

One of our goals and objectives this year includes presenting Houston history through exhibits, to be presented on a quarterly basis. Our current exhibit, *Anita Bryant Comes to Houston*; *June 1977* commemorates the 30th anniversary of a controversial crusade led by singer Anita Bryant. This sparked outrage in the gay and lesbian communities across the country. On June 16, 1977, a protest was led downtown Houston by 4,000 gays, lesbians and their supporters while Ms. Bryant entertained at the Hyatt Regency Hotel. Included are photographs posters, leaflets, full-page newspaper ads, and other materials from the campaign. Also on display are both pro-Anita Bryant "Save Our Children" campaign literature and pro-gay "Vote Against Repeal of Human Rights" materials. This exhibit was originally slated to run only in the month of June but due to popular demand, it has been extended thru the end of July.

Our next exhibit, *African American Texans: Our Legacy* will run August thru November. In case you were not aware, people of African descent are some of the oldest residents of Texas. Beginning with the arrival of Estevanico in 1528,

African Texans have had a long heritage in the state. They have worked alongside people of Asian, Mexican, European and indigenous descent in order to make the state what it is today. Their contributions to the state's growth and development, in spite of the obstacles they have faced, have been truly remarkable. This exhibit highlights the presence and contributions African Americans have made to Texas, especially in the Houston area. We hope you enjoy them both and we look forward to your next visit to the Texas Room.

MINUTES OF THE APRIL 30th, 2007, MEETING

The General Meeting of the Friends of the Texas Room met at 7:00 pm, April 30th, 2007, at the Museum of Printing History after a reception hosted by the new Hospitality Committee composed of Chairman Ann Becker, Jo Lee Haddock, and Barbara Eaves.

Dorothy Knox Houghton introduced the speaker, Dr. Michael Botson, a member of the faculty of the Houston Community College, winner of the Fehrenbach Prize, and enthusiastic researcher in the Texas Room where he found material for his book, *Labor, Civil Rights, and the Hughes Tool Company*. Dr. Botson explained how his research revealed the intersection of the segregation that began with the founding of the company in 1909, subsequent labor organization, and finally the civil rights movement of the 1960s.

Dorothy Knox Houghton led the business meeting. The minutes of the last general meeting on January 22 were approved. Treasurer Cathy Fitch reported that our checking account stood at \$26,259 and the savings account at \$10,234. Membership chair Dorothy Johnson is recovering from knee surgery. Jeff Lindemann announced that Niche Marketing is designing the Friends of the Texas Room website, which the Houston Public Library is hosting. The filming by Jim Bailey for the documentary is soon to be completed and the editing to begin.

Sims McCutchan, heading the new Community Outreach Committee, outlined the Friends of the Texas Room's goal to develop a plan to network with other groups of like interests and to build a speakers' bureau.

Steve Hill, director of the Texas Room, has a need for long-term volunteers, willing to train and sign on for one day a week; particularly wanted is someone to work with the architectural archivist and another to transcribe oral histories.

Sally and Dick Luna are chairing a Publicity Committee for the Friends of the Texas Room. They are compiling a list of media or other sources of pro bono announcements for our programs.

Because Exxon-Mobil makes significant contributions in recognition of employees who volunteer time or give donations to the Friends of the Texas Room, the Board wishes to give a book on the history of the oil industry in Texas in the corporation's honor to the Texas Room.

It was announced that on at 7:30 May 14 the Jewish Community Center will host a program by the authors of the recently published Lone Star of David.

The meeting adjourned at 9 P.M.

Policies of the Friends of the Texas Room

Relating to The Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library

A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items

that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library.

The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library.

The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

CULTURAL MATCHING GIFTS

Are you or your spouse working for or retired from a corporation which makes cultural matching grants or volunteer involvement awards if you give to or do volunteer work for a cultural institution?

Will your employer match your gifts to cultural institutions that qualify under IRS 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code?

The Friends of the Texas Room has such a qualification. Send your corporation's cultural matching funds form with your check for membership in FTR. If you volunteer your time as an officer of FTR or in the Texas Room or HMRC, keep track of your hours and turn them in to your corporation so that the FTR may obtain a grant from your corporation's program. This is "found money" for FTR and can be used towards making a difference to the Texas Room and HMRC.
