THE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Dear Friends,

In anticipation of the new archival wing which will be built behind the Julia Ideson Building, the library administration and staff and the board of the Friends agree on the need for an inventory of the collections to be followed by cataloguing of those items found not to be already catalogued. The entire process (inventory and cataloging) will take several years, and we hope that, if we start now, it can be close to completion by the time the new wing is finished.

To this end your board met recently with Dr. Lawson, Carol Johnson, who is acting head of the HMRC/Texas Room, and several other key administration personnel. We agreed that the Friends would recruit volunteers willing to devote a minimum of one half day per week to work on the inventory. Once the inventory is completed, professional archivists will be hired to do the cataloguing. We hope to complete the inventory of the Texas Room collection by early summer 2008.

To begin this project, we are extremely fortunate to have three eminently qualified volunteers who already have many hours of experience working in the Texas Room. They are Betty Chapman, Sims McCutchan, and Anne Sloan. These three volunteers were among the founders and on the first board of directors of the Friends. They are being trained by and will work under the supervision of Carol Johnson. Phase one will involve examining each item on the shelf in the Texas Room to confirm that it is listed in the online library catalog. We anticipate that their work will be well underway by the end of December so that we will be able to start training more volunteers to begin work in January. A total of about ten volunteers will be needed to complete the initial inventory of the Texas Room Collection by next summer.

MINUTES OF THE JULY 23, 2007, GENERAL MEETING

The Friends of the Texas Room met at 7 P.M., 2007, at the Museum of Printing History following a convivial reception hosted by the Hospitality Committee and a warm greeting to members and guests by Membership Chairman Dorothy Johnson.

President Dorothy Knox Houghton introduced the evening's speaker, Marks Hinton, a graduate of St .John's School and SMU, investment broker, and founding board member and first treasurer of the Friends of the Texas Room. Mr. Hinton became enthralled by Houston's history, leading him to turn to the Texas Room and interviews to unravel the mysteries of our street names. From his book *Historic Houston Streets: The Stories Behind the Names,* Hinton recounted tales that were amusing, tragic, and of great historic interest.

The Hospitality Committee was thanked, the minutes of the meeting on April 30th approved, and Cathy Fitch's treasurer's report was filed. Dorothy Johnson reported that there were 160 members. Sally and Dick Luna were introduced as co-chairs of the Publicity Committee. Dorothy Knox introduced Robin Cavanaugh, Assistant Director for External Affairs at the Houston Public Library, who will help us with publicity.

Sims McCutchan reported as chair of the Community Outreach Committee. He said that they were trying to identify organizations with common interests and had found 25-30 that will be explored further. He also mentioned that the Friends of the Texas Room Board is considering the possibility of an annual award to a person whose research in the Texas Room has resulted in a book, article, film, or other such endeavor.

Jeff Lindemann announced that the Friends of the Texas Room website, after four years of planning, is now up and operating. It is hosted by the Houston Public Library. He expressed his thanks also to its creator, Joyce Evans of Niche Marketing. The website, which includes the complete archives of the *Dispatch*, is found on <u>www.friendsofthetexasroom.org</u>

Dorothy Knox Houghton said that the final editing stage of the hour-long documentary is under way, and the plan is to be able to excerpt segments for customized presentations.

The meeting adjourned at 8:15 P.M.

Policies of the Friends of the Texas Room

Relating to The Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library

A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library.

The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library.

The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

CULTURAL MATCHING GIFTS

Are you or your spouse working for or retired from a corporation which makes cultural matching grants or volunteer involvement awards if you give to or do volunteer work for a cultural institution?

Will your employer match your gifts to cultural institutions that qualify under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code?

The Friends of the Texas Room has such a qualification. Send your corporation's cultural matching funds form with your check for membership in FTR. If you volunteer your time as an officer of FTR or in the Texas Room or HMRC, keep track of your hours and turn them in to your corporation so that the FTR may obtain a grant from your corporation's program. This is "found money" for FTR and can be used towards making a difference to the Texas Room and HMRC.
